# A JEWISH KING & THE COVENANT OF REVIVAL (2 Kings 22:1 – 23:5)

- Rev. Dr. Jack Sin A Sermon Summary

#### 3 Salient Points to consider:

- A) Repair of God's house & the Revitalisation of true worship (2 Kings 22:1 – 10)
- B) Restoration of the Scriptures & Seeking the Will of God (2 Kings 22:11—20)
- C) Recommitment of God's People to Obey and honour God (2 Kings 23:1—5)

#### Background to King Josiah:

- King Josiah, son of King Ammon and Jedidah, daughter of Adaiah of Bozkath, began to reign at the age of 8, for a total period of 31 years.
- He did that which was right in the sight of the Lord. (2 Kings 22:1-2)
- Josiah began to seek the Lord in the 8<sup>th</sup> year of his reign, when he was 16 years old. He was a good king and had a good mother too.
- He began to purge Judah and Jerusalem of all graven images of pagan worship in the 12<sup>th</sup> year of his reign (2 Chron 34:3—10).
- In the 18<sup>th</sup> year of his reign, King Josiah began to repair and "amend" the Temple, the house of the Lord, his God (2 Kings 22:3 –7).

#### A) What did this Jewish king do?

- King Josiah sent his Scribe, Shaphan, to Hilkiah, the High Priest, to tally up the silver that had been collected at the temple gates and pay the workmen for all the repairs and amendments that were completed in the old, unused & dilapidated Temple (2 Kings 22:4— 7).
- During the repairs on the old, unused and dilapidated Temple, Hilkiah found the Book of the Law in the Temple (2 Kings 22:8).
- Hilkiah gave Scribe Shaphan the Book which he then read.



- After that, Shaphan reported to Josiah about the repair and restoration works on the Temple and also about the Book of the Law that Hilkiah found there.
- Shaphan then read the Book of the Law to Josiah (2 Kings 22:9-10).

In Rev.1:3, we are reminded of what to do in these last days with the Word of God. We need to read, hear the words of the prophecy and keep those things that are written therein: for the time is at hand. If we do these 3 things, then we will be blessed of the Lord.



The Jewish Temple was the centre of religious life for the Jewish nation. Hence it is consistent that it should be maintained in a pristine physical condition and façade.

It was built by King Solomon but unfortunately, it was desecrated by Josiah's grandfather Manasseh and later on by Ammon his father. It's important to maintain the physical state of the Church and to restore and revitalize it. How much more important is the house of God today?

#### B) What happened to King Josiah?

- When King Josiah heard the words of the Book, he rent his clothes (2 Kings22:11).
- He ordered Hilkiah the High Priest, Ahikim the son of Shaphan, Achbor the son of Michaiah, Shaphan the Scribe and Asaiah, a king's servant to enquire of the Lord what they should do to appease God's wrath when their forefathers had brazenly defied and forsaken God for other idolatrous worship (2 Kings 22:12 –13).
- They sought the help of the prophetess Huldah for advice. (2 Kings 22:14)
- She told them of God's impending punishment of desolation, curse and evil upon the land and their inhabitants and that Josiah would be spared because of his humility and sincerity in showing his deep sorrow and repentance to God for provoking His wrath (2 Kings 22:15—20).
- After King Josiah's reign (death), God would still impute His wrath and punishment upon the land and its inhabitants for their disobedience and idolatrous pagan worship.
- Have we constantly enquired of the Lord of His will for the major and momentous decisions in our lives? Let us seek and wait upon the Lord be for we decide on any major decisions in life.

### C) How did King Josiah bring about a great revival in the time of the divided Kingdom?

- King Josiah gathered all his people, priests and prophets into the Temple and read out the contents in the book of the Law to them, admonishing them to **obey** God's commandments (2 Kings 23:1-2)
- He renewed a covenant with the Lord to:
  - ...walk after the Lord,
  - ...keep His commandments and
    - ...perform (do) all that is written in the Covenant in this book of the Law. (2 Kings 23:3)
- It was a revival of epic proportion.
- He removed all idolatrous priests and abominations out of all the countries that pertained to the children of Israel.
- He commanded them to keep the Passover to the Lord, as written in book of the Law.
- He thus restored the temple worship procedure for the people and glorified God. We need to return to the house of God and worship him corporately today.

#### Conclusion

Do we need to restore and revitalize our own spiritual lives in such a crucial time like now, in the midst of the pandemic?

Is there something we ought to think about rebuilding our lives, our families, our church and even overseas missions in the will of God?

Something we need to pray and ponder over seriously and act upon too.

The church has a meaningful media ministry in these 4 aspects:


#### 1. Church Website



The church website, www.sovereignhopebpc.org, is managed by our team of webmasters and it provides relevant information on the background, ministry, activities and programme of the church. The weekly articles and the Sunday sermons are put up on the website and it is listened to by Christians from different churches and countries. There is a section on seminars conducted at SHBPC, including themes on depression and suicide, reformation, biblical perspective of pain and suffering, a Q and A and pastoral chats among others. There is also a Chinese and Spanish section with relevant articles and a mission segment of our gospel work in overseas churches and bible colleges in Yangon, Myanmar, Bangalore, India, Batam, Indonesia and other church photo news.

#### 2. The Church Weekly

One of the regular features every Sunday is the SHPBC weekly which has pertinent theological, devotional articles on the different aspects of Christian living and testimonies, photo news, summary of sermons, memory verses and announcements of the church, among others. It is read by readers from about 10 countries and it is also translated into Chinese and sometimes, Spanish.



#### 3. The Church Facebook Page and Zoom meetings



The SHBPC Facebook page has about 200 members and our Sunday sermons are available on it for the edifying listening by its members. A brother often shares the spiritual lessons for the Chinese evening service as well. Our Chinese evening virtual services is an effective tool to connect and communicate with our brethren from different Chinese speaking countries to exhort them with the word of the Lord.




#### 4. Pamphlets, Articles and Tracts

The church produces about 50 pamphlets and articles covering different themes on the bible, theology, church history and Christian living. We have about different tracts in both 10 English and Chinese, with Tamil, Bahasa Indonesian. Thai and Myanmese tracts for outreach purposes as well. They are freely available for anyone to take and distribute as the Lord leads. for edifvina and evangelistic purposes.

## 5. Publication of books and a calendar

The church published a book entitled "The Christian Perspective of the Coronavirus Pandemic and Biblically Related Themes" in Sep 2020. It was recently translated



into Spanish led by Rev Hal Ricker of Guatemala and will be ready by March 2021, God willing. This book has been distributed to churches or individuals in about 9 countries and we have orders from Christians from 4 other countries too. There are plans for it to be translated into Khmer for the Cambodian churches and bible colleges. Our associated mission station, Covenant BPCI in Bangalore publishes a bi-annual Reformation

Now magazine with up-to-date articles

on the reformed faith.

The church also produced a 2021 calendar for the edifying of the saints with relevant biblical verses, church events and important dates and photos.

We acknowledge that without Christ, we can do nothing (Jn 15:5,6). We thank God for his covenant faithfulness and grace in leading and guiding SHBPC in our church media ministry to the edifying of the saints locally and worldwide. It is



our prayer that it will continue to be a blessing to the enrichment of the saints as the Lord leads to His glory.
