1. Fulfillment of Prophecy vs 1-7





2. Fear Overcome by the Shepherds vs 8-24



The angels appeared not to the religious or political elite but to a group of humble shepherds in the field by night. The first words that were spoken by the angels were "Fear Not" (vs 10). We are living often in a world of phobias and morbid fear especially in these 11 months of the global pandemic, with 1.5 million deaths and about 70 million infected. But the coming of Christ is the victory over fear for all who seek and worship Him. Are


you still cringing in fear? There are so many phobias in the world that man is much terrorised or obsessed with. But you need not fear death when there is hope and comfort in the Saviour of the world born in Bethlehem.

Come and seek Him and trust in Him as your Saviour and God, as the wise men of old did. Perfect love from God casts out all fear.

3. Faith Honoured in 2 Persons vs 25-40

There are many who got it wrong during this Christmas season, especially King Herod and the Pharisees and we pray that it will not happened to us. There are at least two people who got it right during the first Christmas season. Two senior persons, Simeon

and Anna were noted by our Lord in holy scriptures as they waited patiently for the consolation of Israel and were rewarded with the privilege of seeing Christ in his infancy (about 5 weeks old) at the temple. True faith will be tested and will pass the test and be honoured by God. Learn to wait upon the Lord patiently and obey His holy will. Be the godly people that remember and




honour Christ in these last perilous days In the right manner in holy worship and adoration.

"Make me a little cake...first.."

Did you know that the heading for this article comes from the Bible?

And it comes from a time where there was a widow who was in great need, living with her son, in a place called Zarephath, where there was also a famine. We do not know her name, but she was very poor, as widows often were, then. There were no government pensions for widows. Things were so bad that food had almost run out and she and her son were facing starvation. And, right at this extremity – a guest arrived!



It was Elijah, a prophet – who had seen her as he entered the city. She was gathering sticks to make a fire to cook what she thought would be their last meal. He asked her for a drink and something to eat.

She hesitated – she had a kind heart and was hospitable, but she was at an end. There was only a little flour and oil left for her son and herself. She explained the situation to Elijah. He encouraged her not to worry, but to go and cook. "Make me a little cake... first", he requested, "then use the rest for your son and yourself". He promised her that the Lord would look after her until the famine in the land was over.

What a difficult option! Many would be cynical and say — well, why is there a famine anyway? If God is so helpful, how come we are in this situation? She could have claimed that her first priority was to her own family. Charity begins at home, they say!

But she didn't. She did as Elijah requested and as a result, the Lord ensured that she always had plenty of flour and oil until the famine was over. You can read the story in the Bible at 1 Kings 17: 8 - 16.



We live in a 'me first' kind of society – and this attitude is encouraged wherever we look – in advertisements, on the television – seemingly everywhere! As a result, we see multiplied many examples of young and old out for

number one! Then, as time goes on, we can become concerned more and more – is my super enough for when we retire? Will we ever pay off the mortgage? The credit card bills get larger and larger. Maybe a rich uncle will leave us a lot of money.

But Jesus warned His followers about problems and concerns in life. He said, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things shall be added unto you". (Matthew 6: 33)

In our sinful, self-absorbed state, many times we are not able to look beyond our needs and circumstances. But, it is as though God speaks to us like Elijah spoke to the woman. "Make Me a little cake... first". Because of our sin, we are separated from God. He has sent His Son, the



Lord Jesus Christ, to die on the cross and to pay the penalty for the sins of all who repent and put their trust in Him as Lord and Saviour (John 3:16). The remedy for our lives is **first** – look to the Lord – come to Him first and be reconciled to Him! Then He will take care of you in more ways than you could ever imagine!
