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The Call of Discipleship

(Discipleship Series Part 1 of 4)

Christian discipleship is a concept exhibited when Jesus Christ elected and hand selected His first followers. A disciple, by definition, is a convinced adherent of a school or individual. In the case of Jesus, His disciples were those who followed Him while He was on earth, as well as those who continue to follow Him and His teachings today.

The Call of Discipleship - The First Twelve

Christian discipleship is evidenced, the day after Jesus was baptized (John 1:35-39). According to this passage, the first two men to follow Him heard John the Baptist declare that Jesus was the Lamb of God. Andrew and his friend (most likely John) believed what they heard and followed Jesus. Before long, they were telling others about this amazing Man of God and forsook everything as true disciples!

Andrew recruited his brother Simon (whom Jesus called Peter); the next day Jesus found Philip in Galilee; Philip found



Nathaniel and soon a movement was born. Not everyone came easily or willingly at first. However, before long, Jesus had twelve disciples, who later died as martyrs for Christ except for John (and Judas Iscariot who committed suicide).

Discipleship and The Transformation Process

Christian discipleship is more than being a believer - it's about being a faithful follower! Once we are saved by Christ, then just like Andrew, John and Peter, we must become His disciples and follow Him. Have you given up all to follow Christ? If so, then you are a modern-day Christian disciple! And there is a serious commitment in the walk of faith before God and men.

The example of the faithfulness of the apostles, who clearly understood their role as messengers of Christ, is for our emulations. Later, when Paul was added to their number (by virtue of his Road to Damascus saving encounter with the risen Christ), he wrote letters to all the churches he helped to set up. These books and letters became the New Testament of God's Word.



The Heart of Discipleship

The heart of discipleship is a total commitment of a child of God to Jesus Christ. That means that one is willing to publicly identify with Him no matter what that cost. That means you are willing to face a hostile world boldly to acknowledge Jesus as Lord and master. Even Timothy was once timid or shy about Christ. Peter denied Christ but repented. We have those lapses, but a moment of failure does not invalidate the disciple's credentials. All of us have times of failure, but we repented of it. And if we willingly affirm our loyalty to Christ, then He will affirm His love to us as well.

On the other hand, those who consistently deny the Lord by silence, by ungodly living, by words are simply masquerading, they are not God's disciples at all.

So, it all starts with that public confession (i.e. it may mean baptism for some today). If someone denies Christ, says they do not believe, they do not care to obey, they cannot possibly meet this characteristic of a true disciple. This is not something we do in our flesh; this is something God produces in us by giving us the heart of a disciple. He gives us a heart to love Him, a heart to want to proclaim Him, a heart to want to announce that we belong to Him.

Secondly, following hard on that one, a disciple not only confesses before men his Lord, but prefers Christ over all others. Verse 34 starts to talk about the family and how the sword comes down between father and mother and sister and brother and enemies become people in your own household, and you cannot love father or mother more than Me and be worthy of Me. You cannot be My disciple if you are not willing to cut those relationships off which are displeasing to God.

And Luke's language is even stronger. Luke in chapter 14 verse 26, "If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and

sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple."

You have to deny your natural human relationships that would constrain you and hold you back from Christ just like you have to deny yourself of pleasure and sin (Romans 6); to lay aside the old self (Ephesians 4:22); and treat your flesh with human contempt (1 Corinthians 9:27).

That is what Jesus is talking about. If there is any human relationship that holds you back from naming the name of Christ, from serving submissively under His Lordship, you are not worthy to be His disciple.

Why is Jesus so strong about this? Because He wants to chase away the uncommitted. You understand that about Jesus? He wanted to drive away the false disciples. He did not want the tares. He did not want the false believers. He did not want them because He did not want them to be deceived, and He did not want His church to be affected by them. So, He chased them away by the strength of the call to commitment.

Finally, the Lord Jesus Christ must be the one for whom we would willingly give our time, treasure, talents and lives. Verse 38, "And he that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me. He that findeth his life shall lose it: and he that loseth his life for my sake shall find it."

Reflections

Christian discipleship begins when you surrender yourself and follow Jesus. By God's grace, it is then accomplished in several ways:

- You can study His Word daily and spend time alone with Him in prayer.
- You can become a member of a Bible-teaching church fellowship.
- You can seek out the companionship of other Christians who are growing with Christ.
- You can participate in ministry and meet the needs of other believers.
- You can share what you're learning about Christ with others, just like Andrew, James, John, Luke, Matthew, Peter, Paul and all the early disciples did.



Our church has been involved in missions in Myanmar in the training of Pastors and Preachers, support of a Christian Children Home and some local churches all these years.



In the wake of the recent earthquake on 28 March 2025 where more than 3300 have died, we are moved of the Lord to support some relief missions to the affected areas of Myanmar in partnership with our trusted Christian brethren there.





A second relied effort is in partnership with Rev Salai of the Evangelical Presbyterian church for the members of the Falam Baptist Church whose church building was severely damaged by the quake as the entire ground floor collapsed. Thank God for His preserving grace upon His people.

A third relief effort is led by Eld Habakkuk and his team to Naypyidaw the capital to evangelise with gospel tracts and provide food for the families affected. Pray for the revival of the nation and saving of souls even in this disaster.

There is support for another relief mission led by Rev David Khobal, President of Myanmar Theological Seminary to provide food and other necessities for both the affected Christian and non-Christian families with a request as follows:

"Thank you very much for praying for us especially for the earthquake affected families in our country. Yes, there are many things to help the

earthquake victims in many different ways. The demands and the needs are huge. Praise God for the Rescue Teams from our neighboring countries to rescue the survivors and help them with their talented ability. There is a short-term aid and a long-term aid to the affected families. We will first do a short-term aid to the affected families."
