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
4 ARENAS TO GROW LIKE THE LORD

I was studying the Gospel of Luke that brought me to examine Luke 2:52 which says, "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favour with God and man."

Not much is recorded in the Word of God about the childhood or youth days of our Lord. This verse has valuable lessons and is expectant with profound meaning and instruction on how our Lord grew in His early years as a child, and how we can help ourselves and our children and others grow in these 4 aspects of life. Consider the following:

1. Growing Intellectually/Mentally

Our Lord grew in wisdom. Growing in wisdom is a conscious and diligent endeavour when we seek to study and comprehend truths as we read His Word and other books on relevant subjects. It is not just mere accumulation of technical knowledge but biblical discernment and godly prudence and making the right decisions in life, with the life skills to come when we know what is right and we are committed to do it right, (not what is liked) as well. Prov 9:10 says, "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: and the knowledge of the holy is understanding."





2. Growing Physically

Growing in the physical dimension is an important aspect of life. Our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, and we need to take care of it. This means regular exercise with sound and healthy diet and sufficient rest too besides others including a strong immune system to fight the virus or bacteria that may attack us. Good stewardship starts at home, and we start by being disciplined in life as we exercise also unto godliness. (1Tim 4:7,8) Keeping a fit physical constitution helps us to be effective in


our secular work or studies and to serve the Lord. The failure to do so and neglect of the health of our bodies has serious consequences for this life.

3. Growing Spiritually

Growth in our spiritual walk of faith with regular devotion is commanded of the Lord and is a sign of health and vitality.

Are you reading the Bible daily and praying and increasing in the admonition of God?

Are you growing deeper in your personal prayer life, and in the faithful stewardship of the resources God has blessed us with?



Do you worship God on the Lord's Day, and hear His Word preached and grow in the knowledge and fear of God with each passing year, or do we just grow older?

Are we glowing and going for Christ, or groaning or growling daily as we live in a fallen and decadent world?

It is your call, and you need to prayerfully decide to do so as the Lord leads. Remember 2 Pet 3:18 which says, "But grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen."

4. Growing Socially

A Christian is not called to be isolated and to live alone, that is to deprive ourselves of the rich resources that comes from the fellowship of the covenant people of God. The concept of a gathered church is the divine idea for mutual encouragement and support from the fellowship of the saints as they meet to worship God, receive the Sacraments, hear the Word and share and encourage one another in the Lord. Heb 10;24,25 says, "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works: not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."



There are some who are disillusioned and distressed with life when they are disconnected from God and the people of God, and that has caused them to be vulnerable to the wiles of the evil one. Anomie is lack of social and ethical standards corporately that can lead to unrest, alienation of individuals, uncertainty and even chaos. It is a manifestation of a broken and depraved society with no regard for God and for the good of one another.

We are created to be together in edifying Christian interactions and socialisation. That interpersonal

network and communication with the people of God is so vital for overall spiritual health and wellness.

A sheep that is far away from the shepherd and the flock is susceptible to temptations and the wiles of the evil one and weakened in its personal safety. We pray to reach out to such a one and he or she need to come back to the shepherding of God and be connected to Christ and the covenant people in the local church.

Conclusion

In summary, there are 4 arenas of growth as we see in the example of our Lord. We need to work on it with each passing year. Do it as an individual or a family and even as a church.

Strive to Grow:

Intellectually in the Knowledge of God,
Physically in Good Health and Strength,
Spiritually in our Intimacy and Communion with the Lord,
Socially in Fellowship with other Believers.

Let us consider working on these with the divine help of God and for the wellness of our body and soul, as this is the Will of God concerning us.

Pastor Jack also shared a devotion on Wednesday Church Prayer Meeting entitled "3 Things that are Good for Us ~ Psalm 73:23-28". Pastor ended on the last night consecration closing

message entitled "Privilege & Joy of Every Christian" ~ 1 Chronicles 23:27-32.

We were indeed very much blessed with all the spiritual nourishment of God's word to our souls.

I would like to share my takeaway lessons & actions from the camp messages as follows:-

Firstly, in the area of "PRAYER" ~ to be more fervent in my own personal prayer life. To

pray regularly for the work of the ministry, for the needs of the members and learning to pray together with others and for others because I believe "a praying church is a growing church".

Attending the church weekly prayer meeting



gives me such a great opportunity.



Thirdly, in the area of "EVANGELISM" ~ to be more intentional and focused. For personal witnessing it is not just giving out a gospel tract or even a Gideon Bible, but to pray and ask God to lead me to someone whom He has ordained to eternal life in order to share the Gospel message. I have to do it more intentional by setting aside a day or two in a month to be more focused. I dare not to ask God, "Give Me Singapore or I die" but I could pray "Give me a soul or I will not rest".

Finally, all of us as members of the One Body of Christ need to continue to **GROW** in our Christian faith (to be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding) and to **SERVE** God (using the spiritual gifts He has given us) for the edifying of the Body of Christ, so that

Sinners are Justified Saints are Sanctified, and God Is Glorified! Secondly, in the area of "FELLOWSHIP" ~ to be more Christ-centred during my time of get-together with others, to encourage one another in our journey of faith and on every occasion also to learn to pray together for each others.

Phaw was taken unwell. She was running a high fever @ 39.5 °C and nursing a terrible bout of cough! Before sending her off to the clinic, James 5:14-16 came to mind. It reads: Is any sick among you? Let him call for the elders of the church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord: and the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up; and if he have committed sin, they shall be forgiven him. Hence, I did just that, informing Pastor Jack, Deacon Yue Kay and Angie about the situation.

Thank God for answering our prayers. Phaw's fever subsided, and she was well enough to go to the camp the next morning. By the grace of God, we did not buckle under the temptation of the evil one to simply give the gathering and fellowshipping of God's people a miss. Upon reflection, it was a different scenario for us not attending the 4th Camp last year. Then, Kin Hoong was hospitalised for her pulmonary embolism condition.

God's plan and will for His children are the best. It is our duty and responsibility to do His bidding, to draw nigh to Him as I was reminded by the messages, group discussions presented amidst all the interactions with fellow campers during the Camp.
